- Setting up a carriage correctly. •
- Correct service to the customers.
- Service of alcohol Sale of Liquor Act- host responsibility.
- Other aspects of the position.

A new Host Handbook shall be produced and issued to all volunteers setting out the updated requirements of the position.

If a Volunteer Host fails to attend and pass this training, until they pass the training, they shall not be permitted to work on any TGR train.


